The Seniors' Community Outreach to Vulnerable

Seniors Funding Initiative supports community-based projects located within the Toronto Central LHIN boundaries that target outreach services to frail seniors population groups.

This program provides seed funding for projects that improve the health results of frail, isolated and vulnerable seniors showing results in reducing hospital emergency room visits and better chronic disease management for the seniors served. The projects need to increase the access to supports and information for seniors through culturally appropriate outreach and support in the community.

Our services focus on mental health and home visit. We appreciate our partners include Don Mills Family Health Team, Newcomer Women Services Toronto, Toronto Public Health, WoodGreen Community Services. In total 102 seniors participating in the project.

Fan Across the Neighbourhood (F.A.N)

- ✓ This is a bridging project links different generations
- ✓ The goal of this project is to minimize the gaps among generations
- ✓ Mentoring younger generation on fan structure meanings
- ✓ Through the fan designing, shaping including painting and/or drawing with stories or poems, making and showing to reveal their life experience, wisdom and knowledge

- ✓ Improve their multi-culture socialization and reduce their social isolation

Senior Access to Food Education (SAFE)



The project focuses on food education including chronic condition vs. nutrition, budgeting, food processing that seniors can manage their diet and eat properly guided by professional consultation further to maintain good health as well as their family members. The goal of the project is to engage seniors and to connect with other generations in order to promote education and learning related to senior chronic condition and daily eating.

We organized focus group discussions and working groups with other generations to raise the questions by seniors in order that we could work on purpose with outcomes; hosted and invited professional nutrition counsellor to deliver workshops on food, nutrition and health cooking & eating.

The workshops include but not limited to the topics, which are Facts on cholesterol; Choose more than 50 ways to prevent diabetes; About high blood pressure; The power of super food; Food chain; Planning on budget and nutrition; Food safety and storage; Local food recognition and smart shopping, and Food preparation and cooking.
